This farm has one of the oldest buildings in the town! (A Dutch stone house, painted white) 11. This farm produces 700 acres of vegetables, fruit, grain, and hay sold in NYC and the Hudson 4. This building once produced and shipped sweet treats -- like Willy Wonka! Valley. 12. This farm grows vegetables hydroponically in large hoop houses! 5. Part of this farmstand building was once used as a child's playhouse. 13. This former dairy farm has a yellow farm house originally built in 1920. 6. This 1950s business originally in the Village of Red Hook sold feed and supplies to farmers. 14. In the '50s, this farm started "pick-your-own" strawberries, letting visitors help harvest 7. The owners of this farm broadcast a radio show called "Red Hook 31" about 1940s rural life. at season's end.
