Find that Farm!

1. This farm was originally named for the nearby White Clay Kill Creek.

2. This farm has unique green barns and once was home to blue-ribbon, award-winning apples.

3. This farm has one of the oldest buildings in the town! (A Dutch stone house, painted white)

4. This building once produced and shipped sweet treats -- like Willy Wonka!

5. Part of this farmstand building was once used as a child's playhouse.

6. This 1950s business originally in the Village of Red Hook sold feed and supplies to farmers.

7. The owners of this farm broadcast a radio show called "Red Hook 31" about 1940s rural life.

18. This historic farm will soon be home to Hearty Roots Community Farm

9. This new business uses Migliorelli barley to make their drinks.

10. This farm was owned and operated by the Fraleigh family for 6 generations.

11. This farm produces 700 acres of vegetables, fruit, grain, and hay sold in NYC and the Hudson Valley.

12. This farm grows vegetables hydroponically in large hoop houses!

13. This former dairy farm has a yellow farm house originally built in 1920.

14. In the '50s, this farm started "pick-your-own" strawberries, letting visitors help harvest at season's end.
